# *Stampin' Up! Materials Used*

## *Cardstock*

1 sheet A4 glossy cardstock  
3 sheets A4 Old Olive cardstock  
1 sheet Vintage Violet cardstock  
1 sheet Basic Black cardstock

## *Ink*

Stazon (Jet Black)  
Vintage Violet  
Old Olive

## *Accessories*

Olive organdy ribbon  
Earth Elements brads  
Stampin Sponges

## *Stamps*

Mixed Bouquet  
Friendship Flowers  
Sincere Salutations

## *Non Stampin' Up! products*

White wax crayon. The Stampin' Up! crayons are watersoluble for watercolouring and so will not produce the same result. I used a cheap white Crayola crayon from a set of 12 my kids had (kids don't use white much!)

# Instructions for Crayon Resist Technique

1. Stamp a piece of A4 white glossy cardstock using black Stazon. In this example I have used the outline stamp of the rose and leaves from Stampin' Up! Mixed Bouquet set. You need to completely cover the A4 cardstock.



2. Using a white wax crayon (I used one from a cheap set of my children's) colour in parts of the image you want to remain white. For the best effect, just colour some segments of the image. I probably coloured about 20%.



3. Cut a stamping sponge into small pieces so you can use a different sponge for each colour ink you are using. I have used Stampin' Up!'s Vintage Violet and Old Olive.



- 3 Dab the ink on parts of the image and then rub in using a circular motion (which also removes ink from the crayon section). Cover the whole A4 sheet using the two colours.



- 4 Once dry you also polish the image with a paper towel which removes more ink from the crayon section and gives a brighter finish. You now have a stamped A4 sheet which you can cut up to use as the patterned section on each of the cards.

# Cutting Template

Standard size A4 piece of cardstock is used.  
(21 x 29.7 cm)
