


Make it with Claire #21

Triangle Fun Fold

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Today we are making fun triangle fold card, where you can get two cards from one sheet of A4 paper. It's simple but has a little extra wow! The card uses the World of Good Suite, from the 2020/21 Annual Catalogue. A great suite for travel and masculine projects.

Measurements: (also see attached template)

Early Espresso Cardstock: 1 x A4 piece, plus another piece 6.5 x 11cm

Misty Moonlight Cardstock: 6.2cm x .7cm

Crumb Cake Cardstock: scrap for greeting label

Shimmery White Cardstock: scrap for stamping and die-cutting globe and stand

Linen thread: Around 40cm

World of Good DSP: Front piece 9.8cm x 14.2cm, under globe: 9.5cm x 6.0 cm, inside card: 10cm x 14.4cm

Step by Step Instructions:

1. Start with an A4 piece of cardstock in Early Espresso.
2. Score it down the centre vertically and horizontally.
3. Cut on the diagonal. This will give you two cards for today's design.
4. Cut the piece of DSP selected for the front (9.8cm x 14.2cm) and cut in half diagonally (make sure you cut from the top RIGHT to the bottom LEFT when the right side of the paper is facing up).
5. Adhere to the front sections of the card.
6. For the front section, you can either start with a rectangle stitched Framelit (the fourth largest one), or a piece of Early Espresso Cardstock 6.5 x 11cm.
7. Cut the piece of DSP 9.5 x 6.0cm and attach it to a thin mat of Misty Moonlight DSP (6.2cm x 9.7cm). Attach to the Early Espresso piece.
8. Stamp and die-cut the globe in Night of Navy and the globe base in Early Espresso.
9. Loop the linen thread and place it heading from top left to bottom right. Attach with some tape in an area it's going to be covered.
10. Adhere the globe and stand over the top of the twine using Dimensionals to lift up.
11. Attach an Antiqued Corner embellishment on each of the four corners (I adhered these with a glue dot).



12. Attach this completed panel to the triangle pieces on the front of the card. As this section ends up quite heavy, it's a good idea to use Tear and Tape which is a strong adhesive (the new Stampin' Seal + will be good for this as well when it becomes available).



13. Attach the piece of DSP in the inside of the card. This piece should be one of the plain or neutral pieces.
14. I also stamped the 'Congratulations on this new beginning' greeting stamp in Early Espresso on the bottom right of this piece.



15. Cut a piece of cardstock 1.9cm (3/4") wide and 7cm long.
16. Stamp the 'Adventure Awaits' stamp in Early Espresso centred on the cardstock.
17. Place into the Pick a Punch (the top pattern in the picture) and punch both ends.
18. Attach over the join of the globe and base using Dimensionals to lift up.
19. Attach the Champagne Rhinestones to the top left (1) and bottom right (2) as shown in the picture below.
